John Webster's play casts the Duchess as the young widow of the deceased Duke of Malfi, resistant to the control that her two brothers, Ferdinand, Duke of Calabria, and the Cardinal of Aragon, want to exert over her life. Both brothers oppose her remarrying: the unstable Ferdinand is unhealthy and possibly incestuously obsessed with his sister, while the ruthless Cardinal strives to maintain family honour at all costs.
